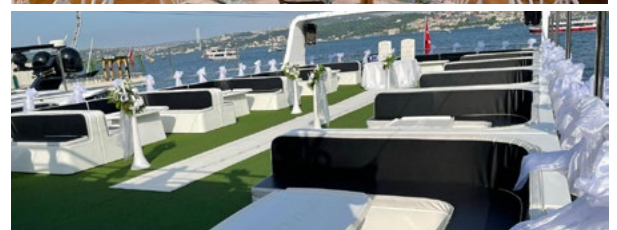

It's about how law impacts the security business. There are reams of laws and regulations for safety protection from things), but security (protection from people) relies on a nebulous legal construct rooted in the law of negligence and the concept of duty of care. This means that reasonable measures must be taken against reasonably foreseeable harm. It can only be tested in a court of law, after an event, and what is reasonable is much debated and constantly evolving. Impact of Terrorism: A Personal Journey for the Protect Duty
We have the absolute honour of announcing the keynote of Figen Murray OBE in her birth city of Istanbul at the CSO 360 Congress. Figen is the mother of Martyn Hett, who at 29 years of age was tragically killed alongside 21 others at the Manchester Arena terrorist attack in May 2017. Since the Manchester Arena attack, Figen has been working with the Government and the security industry to make the tangible changes that can help ensure no other family has to go through what hers has. She is the force behind Martyn's Law (Protect Duty), a legislation requiring publicly accessible locations to improve security against the threat of terrorism. Her ambitions to better understand counter terrorism saw her achieve a distinction in a counter terrorism master's degree from the University of Central Lancashire. Figen's dedication and work in counter terrorism saw her awarded an OBE in the 2022 New Year's Honours List. She is a Visiting Fellow for the Institute of Strategic Risk Management, a member of the senior leadership team for TINYg, and an Associate Member of the Security Institute. Figen's story will be a poignant reminder of why security, intelligence and investigative jobs are so important. She aims to educate on a more personal level about how CSOs can continue to positively impact people's lives. An open Q&A will follow.
