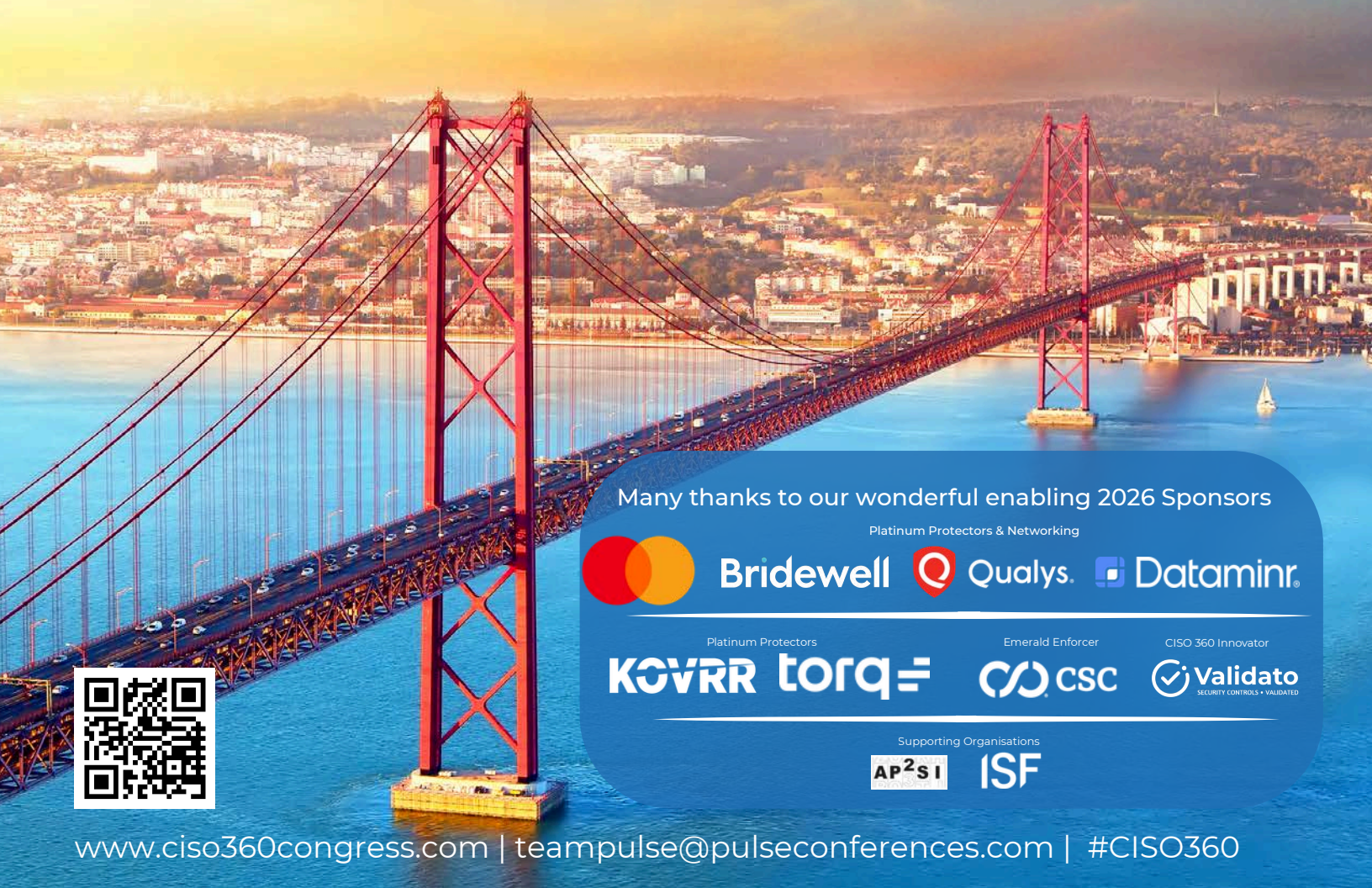

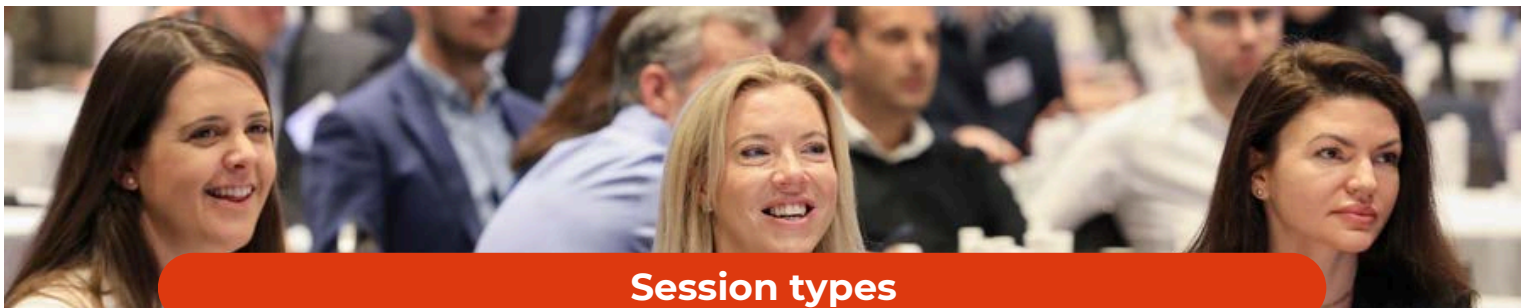

### **Keynote:** Cyber threat landscape: How the Shifting Geopolitical Environment is Reshaping Cyber Risk and Commercial Decision-Making

As CISOs we've battled for years to get our seat at the table, but now that it's becoming more common, how do we make the most of it. ### **Pulse Check:** Reality vs Narrative. AI Agents at Scale. What Has Changed? What are CISOs Experiencing Now?

Moments such as Anthropic's *Mythos* are intensifying the debate, genuine breakthrough or simply the next wave of hype? The reality may be less about entirely new capability, and more about scale. AI is becoming faster at validating, prioritising and acting on weaknesses, turning signal into something operational at unprecedented speed. Where does the real risk now sit? How are CISOs governing autonomous and agent-driven environments without slowing innovation and business adoption?

- Capability vs scale - what has actually changed?
- What does effective governance for autonomous agents look like?
- Managing AI sprawl: moving from "prompt and pray" to provable control
- Identity governance, access and accountability in agent-driven environments
- What are CISOs genuinely seeing inside organisations today versus market narrative?
- What has fundamentally changed - and what hasn't?
- How should security leaders be positioning security differently over the next 12–24 months?
- Classifying AI and AI Risk - How we define what AI is, how expansive the risks are that AI presents -cyber, financial, market..

### **Fireside Chat:** Talk to the Board: The CISO and Board Engagement

The board relationship is the central professional tension for many CISOs in the room. CISOs and directors will be frank about the gap between what CISOs present and what boards actually hear and how to communicate cybersecurity effectively.

### **Panel:** Ensuring cyber governance translates into genuine resilience rather than simply demonstrating compliance

While frameworks such as NIST CSF 2.0 and regulatory expectations like DORA provide strong structure, the real challenge lies in developing metrics and reporting that accurately reflect organisational exposure and enable leadership to make informed, risk-based decisions. Legislative and Regulatory requirements for organisations has hit the streets over recent years, both in the UK and wider. As the combined effect of the NIS 2 Directive, Cyber Resilience Act, the EU Cyber Security Strategy DORA, the UK Cyber Security and Resilience Bill, and updates to extant legislation and industry-specific regulation start to become clear, we look at how organisations can turn the dial and move from a posture of first-line security into true resilience. The role of Governance, Risk and Compliance teams is more vital than ever in ensuring that requirements are understood and enacted whenever changes/updates to the operating environment are made. Operating environments, by their nature, are cross-organisational, often extending into Supply Chains, and the associated GRC influence needs to have a similar, proven reach to embed any form of resilience.

### **Open Panel:** Ten Years On: What Has Changed, and What Hasn't. Veteran and Newcomer

Not a retrospective panel. A structured conversation between CISOs who attended the very first CISO 360 (or one of the earliest editions) and CISOs who are attending for the first time this year. The veteran and the newcomer, in dialogue, about what the function looked like a decade ago and what it looks like now - the status, the stress, the tools, the board relationship, the talent pipeline, the personal toll. Facilitated, intimate – with audience input as to what they see as different. If you can find the right two people and brief them properly, this session becomes the one everyone talks about.

### **Panel:** Offensive Security: Breaking Your Own Defences First

Security leaders are increasingly adopting offensive security approaches to uncover the weaknesses attackers would exploit. From red teaming and adversary simulation to breach-and-attack testing and ransomware, this discussion explores what CISOs are learning when they actively challenge their own defences and how those insights are shaping stronger resilience strategies.

### **Fireside Chat:** Security and AI - Talent and Mentoring for the Future Enterprise

As AI reshapes organisations, security leaders must evolve both technology capability and people. This practical conversation explores how mentoring now goes both ways - with experienced leaders guiding strategy and governance, while younger professionals bring fresh perspectives on AI, technology and new ways of working. Who believes the CISO role will fundamentally change in the next five years?

### **Panel:** Holding the Line: Workload, Morale and the Limits of Security Teams

Expanding attack surfaces, growing regulatory pressure, constant operational demands — and teams that are expected to absorb it all. CISOs share honest perspectives on managing workload and prioritising under constraint, exploring what has genuinely made a difference: in tooling, automation, process, and leadership. What does stretched really look like? What gets dropped? And what does sustainable actually mean?

### Frontier AI Lab - An Insider View

What does it actually look like inside one of these organisations, trying to build something this powerful responsibly - and what should enterprise security leaders understand about that process that they currently don't? A conversation between a frontier lab safety lead and a senior CISO about the gap between how AI risk is understood inside the lab versus inside the enterprise.

- What is the gap between how AI risk is evaluated inside a lab and how it is governed inside an enterprise and who is responsible for closing it?
- What are adversaries doing with AI right now that most security leaders in this room have not yet encountered?
- What should the CISO community be demanding from AI developers, from governments, and from their own boards that it is not yet demanding?

### Panel: Cybercrime, Geopolitics and the New Threat Economy

The lines between cybercrime, state interests and geopolitical disruption continue to blur. Russian-speaking cybercriminal ecosystems have demonstrated how organised ransomware groups, influence operations, financial extortion and strategic disruption can intersect with wider geopolitical tensions and conflict. For CISOs, the challenge is no longer simply preventing attacks, but understanding how global instability, sanctions, proxy activity and politically motivated operations are reshaping the threat landscape facing enterprises.

- How has the Russian-speaking cybercriminal ecosystem evolved over the last five years?
- Where do cybercrime and geopolitical interests overlap and where are the boundaries less clear?
- Are organisations prepared for cyber disruption linked to wider geopolitical escalation?
- How are ransomware groups adapting their tactics, targets and alliances?
- What role do intelligence-sharing, offensive security and resilience now play in enterprise defence?
- How should CISOs communicate geopolitical cyber risk to boards and executive leadership?
- What does preparedness look like when threats operate at both criminal and strategic scale?





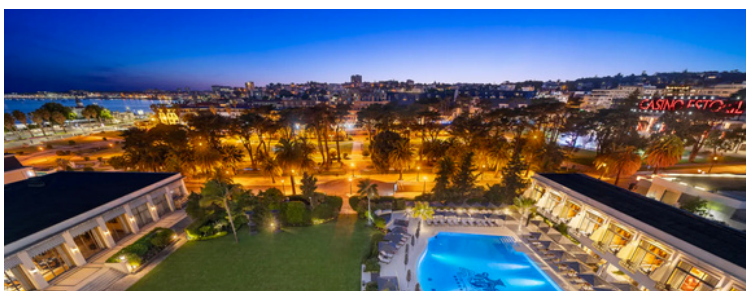
