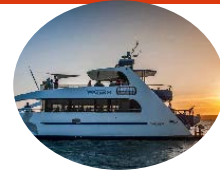

Protecting your CISO value as AI moves faster than any of us

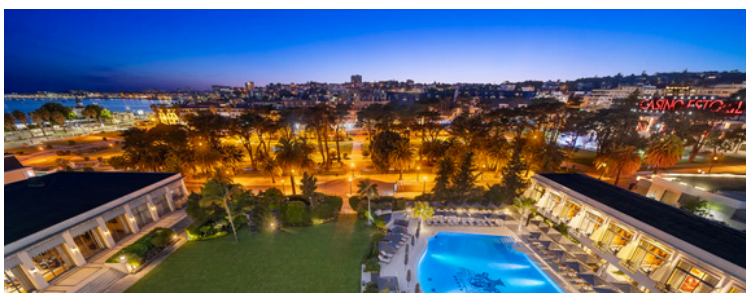
